Campground Rules and Regulations

To ensure all campers enjoy their experience at Loon Lake Campground, we ask that you please follow our rules.

1. For the safety of your children, parents must accompany children to the swimming beach. ***There is no lifeguard on duty.***
2. Limit of two dogs per campsite. **Dogs must be kept on a leash at all times.** Please remember, some children and adults are afraid of dogs. Please clean up after your dog and keep barking (and yelling at your dogs) to a minimum.
3. **Dogs are not allowed at the swimming beach.** If your dogs love the water, try using the public boat landing which is within walking distance of the campground.
4. Quiet hours are from 11 pm - 8 am. Be respectful to your neighbors and keep your voices low and music down during quiet hours.
5. To help prevent Emerald Ash Borer disease, **please do not bring your own firewood into the campground.** Firewood is available for purchase at the campground.
6. No 4-wheeling/ATVs **within** the Campground; use trails as regulated by the State of WI, riding directly from your campsite to the trails.
7. Fireworks are NOT permitted in our Campground.
8. Vandalism is not tolerated. Any person caught vandalizing the campground property will be evicted and charged for the damage. Parents will be held responsible for their children's actions.
9. Watch your vocabulary and avoid offensive and vulgar language.
10. **Please keep your campsite organized and clean.** Please put your garbage in the dumpster provided by the campground. Break down / crush all cardboard and plastic containers. Large items are not allowed in the dumpster (mattresses, broken furniture, etc. - Weekend camping related garbage only). Please do not put anything in your fire pit that will not burn, including glass, cans, plastic bottles, diapers etc.
